Committee Reports



- Word-by-word review of by-laws was done; language was changed (in how processes are done/how selections are made).
- A "chair person" was appointed. A designated time will be provided to individual schools to meet.
- There is a potential influx of students primarily to Nitrauer, due to four new communities actively being built.

- 3. Alex Massie Spiritwear: January 24th, 2019 orders should arrive/be delivered
- **4. Book Nook:** every child was provided one quarter by an anonymous parent to allow each Nitrauer student to purchase a book
- **5.** Laura Cornelius Barnes & Noble night: Now scheduled for 3/20/19 1800-2000. Barnes and Noble book fair agreement copy was distributed for comments/questions. Use of giftcard (online/in-line guidelines provided). Dr. Hancock will request teachers to volunteer to read (teachers will be given \$5 giftcards, for their reading participation).

New Business

1. Book Fair - Alex Massie: Nitrauer profited a total of \$5,168.26 and spent \$9,864.42 (\$9,498.05 at Fair + \$366.37 online); 27 ewallets were setup (\$566.04 spent). \$1,706.62 spent on Teacher/Specialist books by PTO (tax-exempt as it was done at the Fair). 171 books were purchased for 35 teachers/specialists (avg. spent \$48.76 per staff). \$127.95 reimbursed to Alex for decorations/supplies/additional clipboards. Next year plan: Current Chair Laura McCamant (not present) setup Book Fair with new company, Follet. Scheduled for 12/2-12/6/19. Follet does not have posters. If determined to return to Scholastic (rather than change to Follet) - automatic setup date is pending 11/26-11/29/19. Average pricepoint and sample flyer will be collected and discussed (by next PTO meeting).
